




Total beneficiaries of IOM development and humanitarian assistance activities in 2015: 4,636,144

Breakdown of total beneficiaries of IOM assistance activities in 2015, by type of activity




Estimated breakdown of total beneficiaries, by gender



Estimated breakdown of total beneficiaries, by age




Estimated breakdown of total beneficiaries, by type of beneficiary

Estimated breakdown of the top six countries of implementation in the Middle East and North Africa in 2015



Total beneficiaries of non-food items (NFI) and food distribution in 2015: 1,752,448


Estimated breakdown of NFI and food distribution beneficiaries, by gender




Estimated breakdown of NFI and food distribution beneficiaries, by age



Breakdown of NFI and food distribution beneficiaries, by nationality




Breakdown of NFI and food distribution beneficiaries, by type of beneficiary


Breakdown of NFI and food distribution, by types of assistance






Total beneficiaries of accommodation and shelter activities in 2015: 98,112












Breakdown of accommodation and shelter beneficiaries, by type of beneficiary






Estimated breakdown of accommodation and shelter beneficiaries, type of activity








Total beneficiaries of livelihood activities in 2015, by type of beneficiary

















Breakdown of beneficiaries of CCCM-WASH activities in 2015, by type of activity



Breakdown of health-care activities, by type of service (includes health screenings)




Breakdown of health-care beneficiaries, by type (includes health screenings)

Breakdown of health-care beneficaries, by nationality (excludes health screenings)








Breakdown of health-care beneficiaries, by country of implementation (excludes health screenings)







Estimated breakdown of health-care beneficiaries, by gender







Breakdown of victims of trafficking, by primary form of exploitation










Beneficiaries of movement assistance from MENA, by nationality





Beneficiaries of mass movement operations from MENA provided in the context of ongoing humanitarian crises in 2015: 39,636




Beneficiaries of mass movement operations from the MENA region in the context of ongoing humanitarian crises, by type of operation



Beneficiaries of resettlement assistance, by nationality












Internally displaced persons tracked and monitored in Yemen, by age group

Internally displaced persons tracked and monitored in Iraq, by age group




Internally displaced persons tracked and monitored in Yemen, by sex



Internally displaced persons tracked and monitored in Iraq, by sex









Total estimated beneficiaries of awareness-raising activities in the Middle East and North Africa in 2015: 278,761






Estimated beneficiaries of awareness-raising activities, by topic of awareness raising campaign




Breakdown of workshop participants, by topic of workshop



Breakdown of workshop participants, by country of implementation 7,019, 83.9%




Total training participants in the Middle East and North Africa in 2015: 7,751






Breakdown of training participants, by topic of training

Breakdown of training participants, by country of implementation









Total study tour participants in the Middle East and North Africa in 2015: 277









Total conference and media activities participants in the Middle East and North Africa in 2015: 121






Breakdown of participants in media events, by type of participant




Estimated breakdown of participants in technical assistance activities, by gender



Breakdown of technical assistance activities, by country of implementation









Breakdown of total expenditures, by country




